Parents are responsible to supply the following: (PLEASE LABEL ALL ITEMS)

- 1 reusable water bottle
- A pencil case or box (large enough to hold all writing and colouring supplies)
- 1 set headphones (3.5mm jack) in large or medium labeled Ziploc bag
- 2" (two inch) Zippered Binder
- 1 schoolbag/backpack (large enough to hold the binder)
- 1 large boxes Kleenex (not labelled)

Bulk supplies will be purchased by the classroom teachers. Please send in payment of \$40.00 on the first day of school (cheques can be made out to WMS).

The teacher will purchase bulk supplies and necessary student materials such as: Loose leaf, duo tangs, pencils, markers, etc.
