Dear Parent/Guardians,

We are pleased to announce that starting September 2024 at Katherine Friesen, we are introducing a “Bring Your Own Device” (BYOD) practice for students entering grades 7 and 8. This means that students will be expected to bring their own personal laptops to use for educational purposes in the classroom. Laptops will need to have WIFI accessibility and be able to run Google Apps, therefore a device in the \$300 - \$600 range will be enough for this program. Much like personal cell phones and other items brought to school, each student will be responsible for their own device if damaged.

We live in an increasingly digital world and, as a community of educators, we have a responsibility to prepare our students for the future. By incorporating technology into our learning and teaching practices, we can provide our students with more interactive, collaborative, and creative learning experiences. In addition, we can take a hands-on approach in supporting our students to use technology in a way that is safe and responsible. Our intention is not to significantly increase your child’s screen time but rather improve on its quality via critical thinking approaches, source analysis, and access to up-to-date information right in the classroom.

When your child begins school in September, teachers will train their students on effective use of devices and will communicate school guidelines around the use of devices in the classroom to ensure that they are being used for educational purposes. Please note, our IT department will not be responsible for troubleshooting or the repair of hardware issues.

We appreciate your support in this endeavour and look forward to working together to ensure that our students receive the best possible opportunities in their education.
